What data do we collect?

Autism in Context collects the following data:

- Personal identification information (Name, email address, phone number, etc.)

How do we collect your data?

You directly provide Autism in Context with most of the data we collect. We collect data and process data when you:

- Register online or place an order for any of our products or services.
- Voluntarily complete a customer survey or provide feedback on any of our message boards or via email.
- Use or view our website via your browser's cookies.

How will we use your data?

Autism in Context collects your data so that we can:

- Develop customized content and products for you
- Process your order, manage your account.
- Email you with special offers on other products and services we think you might like.

When Autism in Context processes your order, it may send your data to, and also use the resulting information from credit reference agencies to prevent fraudulent purchases.

How do we store your data?

Autism in Context securely stores your data at its office. The hardware and software involved in the data collection and storage is password protected and data are stored off line.

Autism in Context will keep your data until Autism in Context stops its activities. Once this time period has expired, we will delete your data by erasing all data and having the hardware that stored the data professionally destroyed.

Marketing

Autism in Context would like to send you information about products and services of ours that we think you might like

If you have agreed to receive marketing, you may always opt out at a later date.

You have the right at any time to stop Autism in Context from contacting you for marketing purposes.

If you no longer wish to be contacted for marketing purposes, send us an e-mail.

What are your data protection rights?

Autism in Context would like to make sure you are fully aware of all of your data protection rights. Every user is entitled to the following:

The right to access - You have the right to request Autism in Context for copies of your personal data. We may charge you a small fee for this service.

The right to rectification - You have the right to request that Autism in Context correct any information you believe is inaccurate. You also have the right to request Autism in Context to complete information you believe is incomplete.

The right to erasure - You have the right to request that Autism in Context erase your personal data, under certain conditions.

The right to restrict processing - You have the right to request that Autism in Context restrict the processing of your personal data, under certain conditions.

The right to object to processing - You have the right to object to Autism in Context's processing of your personal data, under certain conditions.

The right to data portability - You have the right to request that Autism in Context transfer the data that we have collected to another organization, or directly to you, under certain conditions.

What are cookies?

Cookies are text files placed on your computer to collect standard Internet log information and visitor behavior information. When you visit our websites, we may collect information from you automatically through cookies or similar technology.

What types of cookies do we use?

There are a number of different types of cookies, however, our website uses:

- **Functionality** - Autism in Context uses these cookies so that we recognize you on our website and remember your previously selected preferences. These could include what language you prefer and location you are in. A mix of first-party and third-party cookies are used.

How to manage cookies

You can set your browser not to accept cookies, and the above website tells you how to remove cookies from your browser. However, in a few cases, some of our website features may not function as a result.

Privacy policies of other websites

The Autism in Context website may contain links to other websites. Our privacy policy applies only to our website, so if you click on a link to another website, you should read their privacy policy.
